1. Publication:

Mr. Lancho Rodríguez highlights the need to showcase the foundation's work through a publication, possibly in print media. He suggests that the focus of the article should be on artificial intelligence. The publication should reflect visitor traffic and accumulated traffic, differentiated by country and tool. It is worth noting that the majority of current requests come from Korea, and the most widely used tool is the Python CLI, constituting 75%.

2. Mirror Contract:

Mr. Navas reports no updates on the signing of the contract with the University of Malaga. He hopes to have updates before the end of the year.

3. BAR Association:

Mr. Lancho Rodríguez announces that the dialogue is still pending.

4. Amazon:

In light of Amazon Q's recent announcement, the new Amazon Business Intelligence-oriented Chatbot, Mr. Lancho Rodríguez suggests inviting people from the company to foundation meetings with the aim of joining the Software Transparency Foundation.



5. SBoM (Software Bill of Materials):

Mr. Lancho and Mr. Coccia agree on the need to continue promoting the requirement for a Software Bill of Materials in open-source projects. Emphasis is placed on standardization offices where public tenders should mandate the submission of an SBoM.
